
# **Statistics and Globalization:**

#### **Background and Objectives**

The effects of globalization have been impacting several areas of knowledge, which are facing the need to review concepts and approaches, already stabilized in the past. In the area of statistical production, globalization has been introducing considerable challenges, which have mainly resultedfrom the liberalization of capital movements and the deregulation of financial services, from the increasing openness to trade, investment, tourism and thus international competition, but also from the central role played by information technology.

Statistical production systems remain national, in terms of its institutional organisation and the way in which information is compiled, but the imperative of globalization poses measurement challenges at a higher, broader international level. Statistical concepts, formerly considered as "national", are now in the need to incorporate an international and multidisciplinary dimension, to adequately reflect the on-going reality of the workings of production processes, trade and factor mobility across the globe.

The effects of globalization need to be monitored in as many countries as possible, as economies and societies become increasingly interdependent. In a globalized context, there is growing need for objective, accurate quantified data.

How can national statistical systems respond to these growing challenges and thus contribute to the measurement of the growing intensity of globalization in its various dimensions? How can statistical production contribute to a better structuring of policies and structural reforms, so that national economies can benefit the most from globalization? These are the key challenges this workshops proposes to address.
