Statistics Portugal releases Cultural Statistics

In 2013 40% of the population employed in the cultural and creative sector had a tertiary level of education. The museums registered 11.1 million visitors (approximately one million more than in the previous year). Painting and photography pieces represented a third of the pieces exhibited in temporary exhibitions. Around 36% of the periodical publications were released both in paper and electronic format. Regarding cinema a decrease in movie sessions, spectators and box-office revenues was registered. Live shows accounted for larger number of performances and spectators and less box-office revenues. In 2012 the turnover of cultural and creative enterprises was 4.6 billion Euros.

This publication provides statistical information on several cultural domains according to: <u>education</u>; <u>employment</u>; <u>consumer price index for cultural goods and services</u>; <u>enterprises in cultural and creative activities</u>; <u>international trade in cultural goods</u>; <u>cultural heritage</u>; <u>visual arts</u>; <u>periodical publications</u>; <u>cinema</u>, <u>performing arts</u>; <u>broadcasting and public financing of cultural and creative activities</u>.
